History

CALVERT COUNTY MINORITY BUSINESS ALLIANCE HISTORY

The historical background of CCMBA finds its roots with The Concerned Black Women of Calvert County, Inc. and Calvert County's Branch of the NAACP. The Concerned Black Women of Calvert County, Inc. and the NAACP of Calvert County both sponsored committees that addressed minority business development in Calvert County. The NAACP's Economic Development committee helped to establish a minority business group in the 1980's. In 2004, CBW, Inc. chartered a special Business Directory committee that eventually evolved into CBW's Minority Business Committee – a standing committee of the organization. Out of CBW's business directory committee, the Inaugural Calvert County Minority Business Directory was completed for 2005-2006.

In June 2006, CBW and the Calvert County Department of Economic Development hosted a kickoff planning meeting for the development of a Calvert County Minority Business Organization. All businesses were encouraged to attend to help develop an independent organization whose focus is to support minority business owners living in Calvert County and the Southern Maryland region. In January 2007, after six months of planning, the Calvert County Minority Business Alliance “officially” commenced. The mission of CCMBA is to educate, assist, and develop its members by promoting the growth and retention of minority business in Calvert County and Southern Maryland; provide training and education opportunities; act as a liaison to local, state and federal policy makers concerning minority business needs including recommending programs and services that benefit this segment of the business community as well as increase the County's business tax base; and provide opportunities to market and expand one's business.

SMALL BUSINESS SERVICE — SOUTHERN MARYLAND SMALL BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT CENTER



The Small Business Development Center hosted by the College of Southern Maryland promotes and supports entrepreneurship throughout the Southern Maryland region. The SBDC helps our region's small businesses succeed by providing high-quality, confidential consulting, cost-effective training and valuable business resources. We are part of a national SBDC network—founded in 1979—that helps over 500,000 U.S. businesses annually. The focus of the SBDC is to provide information and guidance for entrepreneurs to help them utilize effective strategies, initiate start-up or manage growth. Through various workshops, training sessions, and one-on-one expert counseling available throughout the region, the CSM SBDC assists over 400 clients each year. Of those, approximately 250 are existing businesses. The assistance and training provided by the SBDC makes a direct and positive economic impact in Southern Maryland.

SMALL BUSINESS SERVICE — MRS. MARY LEE KOLICH, SOUTHERN MARYLAND PTAP Counselor



Mary Lee Kolich is currently serving as a Business and Procurement counselor for the Maryland Procurement Technical Assistance Program (MD PTAP). Ms. Kolich has been with the MD PTAP since 2004 and served as the State Director for three of those years. She returned to her passion which is centered on coaching and helping small and economically disadvantaged businesses enter the government contracting arena and more importantly to win contracts.

Ms. Kolich owned her own business for five years as a value-added reseller and Partner with IBM, Hewlett Packard, Acer, 3COM and Cisco with a yearly revenue of \$1.3M. She provided hardware and logistics support to systems integrators requiring information technology products in support of government projects.

Ms. Kolich served as Division Director and General Manager for two 8a federal contracting businesses over 20 years, assisting them to successfully graduate from the SBA's 8(a) program. In that capacity she planned, prepared and delivered complex automation projects on time and within budget. She has professional sales experience with commercial entities as well as with county and federal government agencies such as: Marine Corps, Army, Air Force, Navy, OSHA, Bureau of Land Management.

An active community supporter she has served on the following Boards: Family Advocacy Center of Southern Maryland, LBCA Neighborhood Watch Program, President Maryland Marine Corps League Auxiliary. She was awarded 2001 Business Woman of the Year by St. Mary's Business Professional Women's Association.

The SMMCOC is unlike many other chambers; it is a Regional Chamber that has accomplished many of its objectives since its establishment in 2012. Its aim is to prepare Minority business owners to become key players in Southern Maryland's growth and educate large corporations on the value that Minority businesses bring as partners, team members and subcontractors. Further, its aim is to collaborate with legislators to craft policy that enhance the business environment for not only Minority enterprises but all enterprises.

The SMMCOC is at the forefront of elevating the Minority business agenda—an effort that has led to its proposing legislation and testifying before Maryland's State Assembly, enabled it to help build business relationships between large corporations and Minority owned firms, and helped it build the capacity of its member companies through technical assistance and access to capital. So when it comes to crafting and implementing regional economic strategies, the SMMCOC is not only at the table, it is engaged, and it is impactful.

Now, in its fourth year, it is broadening its agenda to focus on growing the pool of high-capacity Minority-owned businesses and Entrepreneurs in Southern Maryland. It believes that turning its attention to capacity building is key to helping these enterprises capture some of the billions of dollars in development projects planned in the region, as well as other large-scale business opportunities planned for the greater Washington Metropolitan Area. For large and prime contracting firms, its goal is to become a valued resource for companies seeking to build mutually beneficial business relationships with minority-owned firms.

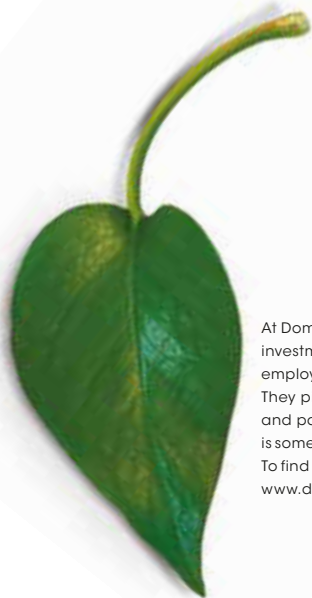
